Personalized medicine, also referred to as precision medicine, is a specific approach tailored to the individual patient based on their predicted response or risk of disease. In order to achieve precision medicine and personalized healthcare, meaningful data are required, at scale, to enable scientists and healthcare professionals to resolve heterogeneity in disease, treatment response and side effects – revealing the underlying biological characteristics that drive or predict outcomes.

New platform technologies and treatment modalities call for innovation in clinical trial designs and endpoints as well as novel regulatory frameworks. With personal medicine becoming more integrated into clinical trials and the clinical practice, its ethical, legal and social implications expand in scope and complexity, and raise novel issues related to privacy and discrimination.

This seminar brings together thought leaders and well-renowned experts from industry and academia, as well as the patient voice. We will discuss advances in personalized medicine that may provide better diagnoses with earlier intervention, and more efficient drug development and more targeted therapies specific to the individual patient and their genome.
